

Influencer Apoorva Mukhija's powerful post, her first after Latent row, police cases

Agency: Actor-YouTuber Apoorva Mukhija opened up about receiving rape and death threats in her powerful comeback post on Instagram. She recently wiped her Instagram clean and unfollowed everyone. Her social media exit came after the controversy regarding Samay Raina's India's Got Latent, where she was one of the panelist. In her comeback post, the Nadaaniyan actor gave a glimpse of all the cruel and negative comments she received after the controversy. From character shaming to rape and acid attack threats, Apoorva showed how she has been bombarded by these comments by social media users. Apoorva, popularly known as The

Rebel Kid, along with Ranveer Allahbadia and Ashish Chanchlani, was among the many panelists who faced scrutiny following their appearance on India's Got Latent, a YouTube show by comedian Samay Raina. In the other post, Mukhija wrote, "Don't take away the story from the storyteller (sic)." With Apoorva announcing her return on Instagram, many look forward to hearing her side of the story, while others want to see her bring more content. The social media influencer deleted all her Instagram posts on April 1, weeks after India's Got Latent row. The controversy erupted over a question posed by YouTuber and podcaster



Ranveer Allahbadia in an episode of India's Got Latent. In a segment, he asked a contestant, "Would you rather watch your parents have sex for the rest of your life, or would you join in once and stop

it forever?" The remark triggered widespread outrage on social media, with many calling it offensive and inappropriate. Recently, Ranveer Allahbadia made his first post on Instagram after the controversy. The

post is a series of photos with his team, dog, and his family. Meanwhile, Apoorva Mukhija appeared in the 2023 television series Who's Your Gynac? and Ibrahim Ali Khan-Khushi Kapoor's Nadaaniyan

Pakistani man among 2 arrested in grenade attack outside BJP leader's Punjab home

Agency: The Punjab Police on Tuesday said it arrested two people, including a Pakistan-based man, in connection with the grenade attack outside BJP leader Manoranjan Kalia's residence in Jalandhar. A top police officer said the case was cracked within 12 hours and termed it a "major conspiracy" aimed at disturbing communal harmony. At a press conference, Additional Director General of Police (Law and Order) Arpit Shukla said Zeeshan Akhtar and Pakistan-based Shahzad Bhatti are the key conspirators behind the attack. The police are probing their links with the banned Khalistani outfit Babbar Khalsa International (BKI), he added. The grenade was hurled outside Kalia's house around 1 am on Tuesday. The former

Punjab minister was inside his house at the time but was not harmed. CCTV footage showed the attacker arriving in an e-rickshaw, taking a U-turn after initially passing the house, and then throwing the grenade before fleeing the scene. A forensic team examined the spot soon after the blast. Police said an autorickshaw used in the attack has been recovered. "The case has been solved in a scientific manner. We are in touch with central agencies and continuing with raids. Preventive measures are also being taken," said ADGP Shukla. He added that the Punjab Police is cracking most such cases swiftly and is committed to maintaining law and order in the state. Manoranjan Kalia, reacting to the incident, said he initially thought the sound was

from a transformer blast or thunder. He later realised it was a grenade explosion after being informed by someone at his door. The blast damaged an aluminum partition, shattered glass windows of his home, his SUV and a motorcycle in the courtyard. This is the latest in a series of grenade attacks that have rocked Punjab in the past six months. Since mid-October 2024, the state has witnessed at least 16 such incidents, targeting a mix of police posts, residential areas, religious places, and now a political leader. These include blasts at police posts in Amritsar, Nawanshahr, Batala, Gurdaspur, and Patiala, as well as attacks on the residences of police officers, civilians, and even a temple in the Khandwala area of Amritsar.

took place on April 4 at the Election Commission of India headquarters, where the Trinamool delegation had gone to submit a representation. Trinamool MP Saugata Roy also reacted to the videos and said that Trinamool's firebrand leader Mamata Banerjee should be informed about it. Roy, however, said that he wasn't present

aid and advice of the Council of Ministers, the Governor has to take a decision within one month. In case of withholding of Bills or reservation for the President contrary to the advice of the state government, the Governor shall take decision within three months, it said. In case of presentation of Bills after re-consideration by the state Assembly, the Bills have to be assented to by the Governor within one month, the Bench said.

Pronouncing the verdict for the Bench, Justice Pardiwala, however, said there was no concept of "absolute veto" or "pocket veto" under the Constitutional scheme. The top court set timelines for the Governors' decision under Article 200 on Bills sent him by the Assembly for assent. A Bill can be reserved for the President only at the first instance, it said. Saurabh Rajput, a former Merchant Navy officer, was found murdered on the night of March 4 at his home in Indiranagar, Meerut. According to police, Muskan and her lover Sahil allegedly drugged and killed Saurabh before dismembering his body and hiding the severed parts in a blue drum filled with cement. Jail authorities said Sahil's grandmother Pushpa had visited him at the jail on Monday, but no one from Muskan's family has visited her yet. Senior Jail Superintendent Dr Viresh Raj Sharma said Muskan will now undergo an ultrasound to confirm the pregnancy and determine its duration.

BookMyShow to Kunal Kamra: We have NOT delisted your shows or you as an artist

Agency: Online ticketing platform BookMyShow has issued a statement addressing allegations that it delisted comedian Kunal Kamra and his shows amid political controversy. Responding to Kamra's open letter on X, BookMyShow clarified that it has not removed Kamra or his performances from its platform, emphasising that decisions regarding show listings are made by organisers or venues. In its

statement, BookMyShow highlighted its role as a neutral facilitator of ticket sales, operating in compliance with Indian laws. "Facts on our role have been misrepresented in the public domain. Our role is to provide a platform for ticket sales of live shows, and it is the decision of the organiser or the venue to list or delist their shows," the company stated. BookMyShow is a platform to facilitate the sale of tickets and operates

the business with neutrality and in compliance with the applicable laws of India. Facts on our role have been misrepresented in the public domain. Our role is to provide a platform for ticket sales of live shows and it is the decision of the organiser or the venue to list or delist their shows. The content of each performance is solely at the discretion of the performer or the organiser (as the case may be) and does not bear any representation of

our views. We work with all venues and promoters on mutually agreed upon commercials to provide our ticketing service, as would be the case with any business. We do not restrict any artist from selling their show on their own website, should they choose to do so. Our platform is about bringing people together through shared experiences, regardless of their beliefs. We remain committed to delivering the best possible service and experience

for everybody. Kunal Kamra recently called out online BookMyShow, demanding clarity on his status after being delisted amid political pressure. In a detailed post on X, Kamra requested that the platform either reinstate his ability to list shows or provide access to audience data collected from his performances.

In his recent post, Kamra directly addresses BookMyShow's role in the live entertainment industry, which claims restricts artists' access to their audiences.

acknowledging its need for state cooperation. "I understand that you need a cordial relationship with the state, and I know that Mumbai is a major hub for live entertainment.
